Bedford Cemetery Spotlight Bedford's Unknown Soldier

In October, 1862, the Civil War had raged for seventeen months and already claimed the lives of several Bedford men and 28 would be lost by the end of the war. Our unknown soldier of Bedford, age 18 enlisted in the 16th New Hampshire Regiment with two other Bedford boys. After a grueling trip in an unseaworthy side-wheel steamer, they arrived for duty in the swamplands of Louisiana and the Mississippi River. While they engaged in usual infantry work and gunboat service, not one soldier was lost to combat yet their group was still decimated by an enemy: disease. Twenty three percent of the Regiment died of disease, the highest percentage of any New Hampshire Regiment. Dysentery claimed several men including the assistant surgeon after three weeks of suffering. In July of 1863, six men perished of malaria in one day. As the end of the nine month enlistment period approached in August, 1863, the surviving men of the Regiment boarded a stern wheeler to travel North up the Mississippi, leaving soldiers too sick to travel in Natchez, Vicksburg, Memphis, Mound City and Cairo Illinois. Our unknown soldier became sick and on August 13, he was left at Vicksburg. He lingered there and died one week before his enlistment expired. Another Bedford man in his Regiment, Robert French, also became sick and was left at Memphis where he died the day after his enlistment expired so his death did not qualify as a "war death." Our unknown soldier was eventually shipped to Bedford and he lies in the Bedford Center Cemetery.
