### Bedford Cemetery Spotlight William Boynton

"William Boynton arrived in Bedford in the 1700's. The Boyntons owned farmland along what is now called Boynton Street. On the night of November 14, 1858, Charles Boynton, William's grandson, left Moore's tavern on what is now Wallace road at about 8 PM. He was driving a horse-drawn wagon and had gone only about a half mile and was near "the Jenkins house" when the horse abruptly stopped, sending Charles out of the wagon and onto the road. The horse began walking, pulling the wagon forward but only until the front wheel rested on Charles' throat. The horse apparently allowed the wheel to stay there for some time, at least until Charles was strangled to death. Charles was found in the road the next morning with the wagon wheel still imprinted on his neck but the horse and wagon had wandered away. Charles Boynton was buried in the Bedford Center cemetery."
